

We at ICBD are finalizing the ICBDSR Birth Defect Report based on your latest feedback, comments and data checks. We highly appreciate your feedback and partnership in this major overhaul aimed at enhancing the relevance of surveillance information within and between countries.

After the final version of the report is issued, the next project is revising and clearly articulating the definitions of birth defects to be used in future reports. We thank those of you who kindly volunteered to help in developing this document.

Finally, as you will have seen, we will be running the pre-conference workshop at the 2025 Annual Meeting. Currently we are thinking of building on the experience of the 2024 workshop, with interactive case studies and hands-on exercises. From the initial feedback, focus areas will be improving the quality of diagnosis and reporting of birth defects, as well as data display and visualization. Stay tuned, more to follow.

Congenital Heart Defect (CHD) Awareness Week – February 7-14, 2025

February 7-14 is Congenital Heart Defect (CHD) Awareness Week. A congenital heart defect is a structural problem with the heart that is present at birth whether caused by genetic or environmental causes. They can affect the walls of the heart, the valves, or the blood vessels adjacent to the heart, and are the most common type of birth defect affecting about 1% of infants. These defects can range from mild, a small hole in the heart wall that closes on its own, to severe malformations that can be life-threatening. About 25% of infants born with CHD will have critical CHD which will require procedures or surgery in the first year of life.
